Academic Search Ultimate database



Academic Search Ultimate is a **general purpose database** that contains scholarly literature from a variety of sources and disciplines. Because it covers a wide range of disciplines, it is a **very good resource for first-year students**, or a place to begin before switching to a discipline-specific database for greater depth.

Getting started

You want to find peer-reviewed research articles on the topic of trauma-informed practices in schools. Prepare to search by **generating keywords** and breaking down your topic into the concepts you want in the search results.

For example:

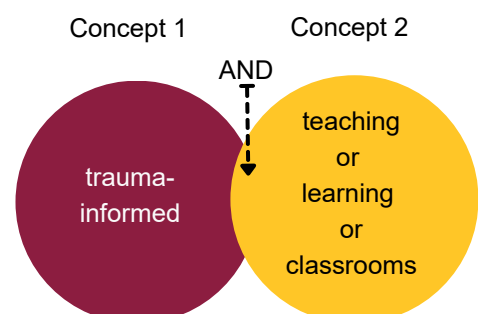
Concept 1: **trauma-informed** is a type of practice.

Concept 2: **teaching** or **learning** or **classrooms** are places to apply trauma-informed practices.

A note about the power of **and, or** in searches:

Use **and** between your concepts to narrow search results to items with both concepts.

Use **or** between keywords to broaden the search to include related keywords for a single concept.





Tip 1 Searching

Enter keywords in the search field. Use keywords that are central to your topic or argument. Academic Search Ultimate may also offer suggestions when you type in the search fields.

For example, if you are researching trauma-informed practices in education, you could enter the following keywords.

Search articles, books, journals & more

Searching: Academic Search Ultimate Basic search

trauma-informed

AND teaching or learning or classroom

AND

+ Add fields Search



Tip 2 Limiting results

Sometimes narrowing search results is necessary to meet the needs of an assignment. Below are some of the filters you can use to narrow search results in Academic Search Ultimate; these can be found on the top, above the search results.

'All Filters' opens a dialogue box to all of the available filter options.

trauma-informed AND (teaching or learning or classroom)

'Full-Text', 'Peer Reviewed', 'All Time', 'Source Type' are common filters available for quick access.

Limit your search with 'References Available' to see how many times the article has been cited by others.

Use Publication date for custom date ranges (MM/DD/YYYY)

Select 'Source Types' to filter for academic journals, magazines, newspapers, and more.

Filter results by the 'Subjects: Thesaurus Term' featured in the EBSCO thesaurus list.



Remember to reset filters before conducting a new search!

Limiting search results will reduce the total number of results. If you had too few results in your initial search, you may want to try searching with different keywords.



Tip 3

Evaluating results

Begin by reading the abstract by clicking more to determine if the topic, variables studied or type of study meets your needs.

Check here to see if it is Peer reviewed and the type of source

Use the Title, Abstract and Subjects areas to find additional keywords for future searches.

Click 'Access options' to view the full article and 'View details' to open up the full record.

Disparate adult responses to student behavior, combined with increases in mental health issues and student **trauma**, compound the equity gap of racially minoritized students. Providing a two-prong approach that includes (a) SEL curricular interventions that are not color-blind embedded within (b) a **trauma-informed** framework supports racially minoritized students' well-being while simultaneously addressing the equity gap within the (in-person and distance-learning) **classroom**.
